



# My Highway to Heaven Carlo Acutis

The only official documentary endorsed by the Acutis family, that offers access to the short yet remarkable life of Carlo Acutis "The Saint of the Internet", recently canonized by Pope Leo XIV.

Featuring testimonies and exclusive contributions from Mons. Gianfranco Poma, his parish priest, the film traces how an ordinary teenager harnessed technology to spread the Christian faith worldwide. Carlo's story resonates far beyond the Church.

At just fifteen, he succumbed to an aggressive form of leukemia, leaving behind a legacy of compassion, generosity and a digital archive of miracles that continues to inspire millions.

"A hot-air balloon, to rise higher, must shed its weight; so too the soul, to ascend to Heaven, must cast off even the smallest burdens—those venial sins."





Between science and faith, a journey into the mystery of the Eucharistic miracles inspired by the exhibition conceived by Carlo Acutis, newly proclaimed Saint.


This documentary shows Eucharistic miracles that have taken place from the 1990s to the present day, in cities across Mexico, Argentina and Poland.

The Shroud of Turin remains one of the most studied and debated relics in history — a mystery that continues to fascinate believers and scientists alike.



#### The Oldest Gospel The Hanna Papyrus

An unprecedented and moving journey inside the Vatican Apostolic Library, uncovering the world's oldest Gospel, the Hanna Papyrus, revealing its secrets and curiosities along the way.

The Hanna Papyrus is an extraordinary relic, carrying with it eighteen centuries of history. Remarkably well preserved, its fragile fibres contain the text of two Gospels bound together as one. Its story is steeped in mystery: from its sudden appearance on the antiquarian market in the late 1950s, to the changing of hands that followed, and finally the gift that placed it in the Vatican Library.





# St. Peter's and the Papal Basilicas of Rome



#### A murdered Judge Blessed Rosario Livatino

In 1980s Sicily, young judge Rosario Livatino stands out as a pioneer in the fight against the Mob.

With rare insight and determination, he is among the first to unravel the complex web of Sicilian organised crime. His brilliant career is brutally cut short on 21 September 1990, when he is assassinated by the Stidda - a criminal group formed by defectors from Cosa Nostra - on his way to the Agrigento courthouse. An unexpected witness, Piero Nava, decides to testify against the killers — the first Mafia witness in Italy — and will be forced to abandon his identity and his life forever.

This documentary portrays an incorruptible magistrate and the true cost of justice in a land scarred by violence.



#### Standing up to the Mafia Don Puglisi

55 mins

"I was expecting it." With these words — his last — Don Puglisi confronted his fate. Why was he so certain that the Mafia would kill him?

Why did a parish priest working on the city's margins pose such a threat to the most powerful criminal organisation in Italy? The answers come from those who knew him: nuns and priests who shared his mission, young people of Brancaccio once saved from the streets and now grown adults, journalists who chronicled the social and criminal context of Palermo, and Vatican officials who oversaw the process leading to his beatification.

Smiling at death, Don Puglisi accepted it with serenity and courage, fully aware of defying the Mafia — a martyr whose faith proved stronger than violence.



#### A priest against the Mob Don Peppe Diana

Don Giuseppe "Peppe" Diana was only thirty-five when he was murdered by the Camorra, one of the oldest and most powerful Mafia organisations in Naples.

Christmas 1991, in Casal di Principe. His manifesto "For the Love of My People" was read aloud in every parish: words of hope and resistance that condemned the Mafia mentality and rejected resignation to a criminal system, but also words that would seal his fate.

One morning in March 1994, Don Peppe Diana was shot dead in his sacristy, just before celebrating Mass.

As a parish priest who defied the Mafia with faith and words, his martyrdom endures as a living witness of the Gospel against the Mafia.



#### A Priest for the Least Blessed Don Luigi Maria Palazzolo

#### What does it mean to devote one's life entirely to others?

In nineteenth-century Italy, Blessed Don Luigi Maria Palazzolo answered this question by dedicating himself to children living in desperate conditions. He built places of community and experimented with new and alternative approaches to education, far ahead of his time. He was also the first to involve a woman teacher, Teresa Gabrieli, in the education of girls — a bold and pioneering act that challenged both social norms and religious conventions.




#### A young hero showing mercy and resistance in the face of oppression.

This documentary tells the story of a young man whose courage and faith transcended oppression. Founder of the clandestine newspaper II Ribelle, Blessed Teresio Olivelli risked everything to challenge Nazi and Fascist ideology, ultimately enduring imprisonment at Fossoli and deportation to a German concentration camp. Amid unimaginable brutality, he devoted himself to helping fellow prisoners, which culminated in an act of ultimate mercy—giving his life to save another.



#### A Mystic Among the People Brother Tommaso

### Brother Tommaso: a mystic, miracle-worker, and preacher who spoke to the hearts of ordinary people.

This documentary retraces the life of a seventeenth-century Capuchin lay brother whose mysticism, miracles, and spiritual guidance left an enduring mark across Northern Italy and Austria. Journeying from the valleys of Bergamo to the heart of Tyrol, the documentary explores a path far removed from the intellectual circles of his time. Though contemporaries called him "an illiterate man," his closeness to ordinary people earned him recognition as "one of the greatest preachers of Tyrol," revealing a life where humility, faith, and devotion spoke louder than formal learning.



#### Beyond Prison Three Lives, One Hope

### Beyond prison bars and prejudice: three inmates seek redemption through work, study, and faith.

This documentary follows three inmates at Padua's Due Palazzi prison as they navigate the difficult path of re-education and redemption. Guided by chaplain Don Marco Pozza, the film offers an intimate look inside the prison walls beyond the bars, beyond the doors, and beyond prejudice. Through work, study, and sport, facilitated by the institution in collaboration with local cooperatives, the prisoners confront their past mistakes and strive to rebuild their lives. The narrative weaves together the voices of the prisoners, prison staff, and the director.

A story of despair and renewal, it highlights the rediscovery of humanity in those who face the pain they have caused—to victims, families, and themselves—and the possibility of a future beyond the prison walls.



#### Full of Grace A Madonna for a day



Three young girls from Calabria compete for the honor of portraying the Madonna in a 500-year-old festival, in a delicate balance between visibility, faith, and cultural contradictions.

Nicole, Giada, and Mariateresa, three 11-year-old girls from Palmi in Calabria, dream of portraying the Madonna during the Assumption festival (the Varia), a local tradition that has been alive for 500 years. In each edition, a girl is chosen to ascend a sacred 17-meter-high carriage carried on shoulders in a procession. Through their eyes, the documentary explores themes such as physical appearance and the need to be seen, including the voices of the citizens of Palmi and the contradictions of the event that moves between poetry and kitsch, courage and recklessness, present and past.

#### Turoldo and Pasolini: two voices, one land, a shared vision.

This documentary illuminates the intertwined lives of Aldo Turoldo and Pier Paolo Pasolini, tracing the threads that connect two extraordinary figures of twentieth-century Italy. Anchored in the landscapes of Friuli—Coderno, Casarsa, and the River Tagliamento—the film situates their childhood and youth within the shadow of Fascism, war, and the Resistance.

Through intimate storytelling and evocative visuals, it portrays not only their intellectual and artistic journeys but also the vibrant culture, traditions, and diversity of Friuli—the fertile ground from which both men emerged. Though their worlds were different, Turoldo and Pasolini spoke the same language, revealing a profound brotherhood and a shared vision rooted in their homeland.
